



EMERGENCY ORDER

CALHOUN COUNTY JUDGE AND COMMISSIONERS COURT ORDERING THE TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF CALHOUN COUNTY BEACHES, PIERS, KING FISHER PARK, LITTLE JETTIES IN PORT O'CONNOR, TEXAS, BOGGY BAYOU NATURE PARK AND OLIVIA HATTERAS PARK IN RESPONSE TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY COVID-19

Effective April 8, 2020

Governor Abbott has declared a state of disaster in all counties in the State of Texas in response to the imminent threat of the COVID-19 pandemic. Beginning March 17, 2020 Calhoun County implemented a series of emergency orders and declarations to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

WHEREAS additional restrictions and orders are needed during the COVID-19 public health crisis for the health and safety of the citizens of Calhoun County, Texas;

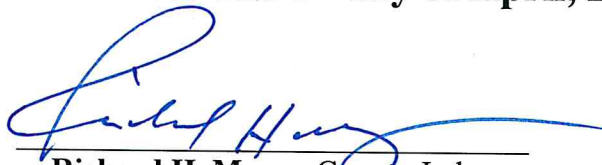
NOW THEREFORE, I, Richard Meyer, County Judge for Calhoun County do hereby pursuant to the authority granted by the Chapter 418 of the Texas Government Code, **FIND AND ORDER**:

1. that this Order supplements and does not replace prior County Orders relating to the COVID-19 State of Disaster;
2. that this Order is necessary for health and safety of the citizens of Calhoun County, Texas;
3. that all public beaches in Calhoun County, Texas and all piers owned by Calhoun County, Texas shall be closed to the public beginning at April 9, 2020 at 1:00 p.m. and shall remain closed through April 15, 2020, unless further extended by separate order; and

4. that King Fisher Park, Little Jetties in Port O'Connor, Texas, Boggy Bayou Nature Park and Olivia Hatteras Park shall be closed to the public beginning April 9, 2020 at 1:00 p.m. and shall remain closed through April 15, 2020, unless further extended by separate order.

ORDERED this the 8th day of April, 2020.

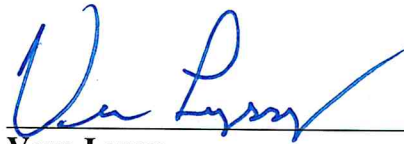

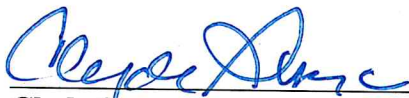
