There is 1 new confirmed positive case of COVID-19 in Calhoun County as of Thursday, April 9, 2020.

There are a total of 14 confirmed positive cases in Calhoun County.

Effective Thursday, April 9, 2020 at 1:00 p.m. all public beaches in Calhoun County, Texas and all piers owned by Calhoun County, Texas shall be closed to the public and shall remain closed through April 15, 2020, unless further extended by separate order.

King Fisher Park, Little Jetties in Port O'Connor, Texas, Boggy Bayou Nature Park and Olivia Hatteras Park shall be closed to the public beginning April 9, 2020 at 1:00 p.m and shall remain closed through April 15, 2020, unless further extended by separate order.

Please limit the number of people shopping at the grocery store to one person per family or household. This will help eliminate unnecessary people being out in public and assist in slowing the spread of COVID-19.

As a suggestion, please wear a face covering or mask while out in public to help protect yourself and others.

A reminder that Calhoun County is under curfew from 10 pm to 4 am until further notice.

We want people to think about how their actions can put others at risk.

People should only leave their house for essential activities, which include getting medical supplies, going to the doctor, going to work if you are considered an essential employee or getting groceries.

Practice social distancing, at least 6 feet, whether you are on land or in a boat.

Minimize social gatherings and minimize in-person contact with people who are not in the same household.

Practice good hygiene, environmental cleanliness and sanitation.
